Indeed, before the sale of Fasque early in the 21st century, it was possible to see examples of this bag when visiting the house! Since the sale to private developers, Fasque has become known to a wider audience through its use as a venue for weddings and other events. However, to many, Fasque is a place for an enjoyable ramble in beautiful grounds, surrounded by magnificent trees and a variety of plants and birds.
