Auchenblae Lawn Bowls Club

Auchenblae Bowling Club aims to attract more new players this coming season but a start date for the new season (normally mid-April) cannot yet be confirmed

This is because the recent storms caused so much damage bringing many tress crashing down in the Den that the area has had to be closed to public access due to the dangers of fallen branches. The gales left some trees unstable at their roots with potential for some further falls.

While strenuous and hazardous work is underway to clear the fallen trunks and make the area safe, we patiently await news. We hope that at best we can get back on to the bowling green sometime in April.

At this stage it is looking that the bowling green surface has not suffered any great harm but we shall have to wait until it is safe for the grass surface to be cleared of branches and twigs debris and enable a thorough inspection.

Any adults in the area - and especially newcomers to the village - who might like to try out bowling this summer with a view to taking up the game are welcome. Bowling provides gentle non-strenuous exercise for all ages except young children for whom bowls are too heavy and too difficult to handle and control.

Current club members will meet on Saturday 12th March for their Annual General Meeting. They will consider plans for the summer including to attract more parents, grandparents and guardian carers of children age 9 upwards who would like to give bowling a try. A parent grandparent or carer can enrol as a Full Member and bring their child/children with them to the green.
