Bridge updates courtesy of Councillor George W. Carr

On Abbeyton Bridge

- Still on course for this year in terms of design and awarding a contract.
- Budget is still in place funded completely by Aberdeen Council from the IF1 funding stream.

It will be built by Network Rail.

On Fordoun Bridge

- They have tidied up the unsightly barriers.
- Funding is in place for the traffic control solution.
- That work was scheduled for last year, but is dependent on utilities Water, BT, Power etc. who have infrastructure over that bridge.

It has been challenging to say the least to get these utilities to commence their re-routing works, so unfortunately I don't as yet have a timescale, but will keep asking.

On Laurencekirk Junction

- Again, not an Aberdeenshire project but the catalyst to get it moving was the Westminster City Deal.
- Access and compulsory purchase have been holding up this project.
- However, Tess White MSP has had regular meetings with Council, Transport Scotland and more progress has been made in the last 6 months, than the last 10 years.!
- She has been very effective at getting these key players around the table, and Aberdeenshire Council are working up plans and budgets to resolve access concerns, should that be required to bring this to a solution.

Auchenblae Bridge near Golf Course (from Donald Macpherson, Bridge (structures) Manager)

We plan to carry out repairs to the masonry parapet and to install a sacrificial barrier in front to prevent future damage to the masonry from vehicles. This work is currently schedule for the first quarter of financial year 2023/2024.


Auchenblae Parks Committee



This year notches up the 110th birthday of lawn green bowling in Auchenblae.



AUCKINE AE BOWLING GREEN

The bowling green of the charming village of Auchinblae is situated in beautiful surroundings in the Den to the west of the village. When the Den became village property twenty-eight years ago two fine tennis courts were laid down and preparations made for a bowling green. A flat part at the northern end of the Den was cleaned, levelled, fenced, and sown out as a bowling green. In 1913 the green was opened by the late Sir Robert Williams, Bart. of Park, who then occupied Drumtochty Castle.

Sir Robert, while in residence at the Castle, took a kindly interest in village affairs and was always willing to help long after he left the district. The war years interfered with the development of bowling

here as elsewhere, but from 1919 onwards there has been a steady growth in the popularity of the game locally. Although the green is the property of the Village Parks Committee, the Bowling Club a few years ago raised funds for the extension of fencing of the green.

The club possesses a handsome challenge cup presented by Mr Donald Cooper, bank

agent, and the competition for it as a champion trophy is very keen. Prizes have been given for some time by Mr Alexander A. Middleton, Edinburgh, a former towns-

The club is fortunate in having as secretary and treasurer Mr Charles L. Simpson. A keen bowler, he throws himself heartily into the work of running the affairs of the club. His enthusiasm, his willingness to help, and his genial nature all tend to make the Auchinblae Bowling Club, what a club should be a harmy Club what a club should be-a happy brotherhood.
