Auchenblae Lawn Bowls Club

It was great seeing Auchenblae Scouts & their leaders Ralph & Carla enjoying a bowls session on the Den green hosted by Auchenblae Bowling Club on 23rd August. The Club provided its own stock of bowls and equipment for the Scouts to use.

Some youngsters had played bowls before - at the Bowlng Club's coaching sessions for the primary school in previous years. But for some it was new and all soon rated it good fun.

Half of the Bowling Club's small group of just 12 members volunteered in coaching the Scouts - aiming to ensure the youngsters had a fun session learning bowls with the hope that the experience attracts the youngsters and their families to join the Bowling Club as members.
