## Auchenblae Lawn Bowls Club

Auchenblae Lawn Bowling Club members kept rolling during this pandemic year 2020 season - enjoying some fun and exercise while ensuring compliance with public health guidance and government-imposed restrictions for social distancing to prevent transmission of infection.

The Club this year had only 12 subscription members - a slight reduction on last year. Nonetheless, members ensured the Club contributed its usual 'Green Fees' payment to Auchenblae Parks Committee for grass cutting and green maintenance, sustaining this wonderful community-owned asset fit for future generations of players.

After the 'Lockdown' period was eased at the end of May, national guidance enabled some outdoor group sports including bowling. So Auchenblae Bowling Club members started up bowling, adopting protocols published by the national sporting body Bowls Scotland. These managed safe social distancing on the green and safe handling of equipment.

Needless to say all the usual annual seasonal fixtures between various clubs were abandoned but it was possible to organise methods for individual players to have a fun game within the guidance's limiting numbers of players. Auchenblae has 5 rinks so it was possible to allocate 2 of the rinks for play, ensuring the minimum 2 metres space between the rinks. The players themselves ensured the 'wide berth' between each other!

The normal rules of play were adapted so that only one designated player handled and positioned the mat and only one designated player handled and positioned the target 'jack'. Within these 'rules' members found challenge and fun. A number of 'hat' play sessions were held - as traditionally - on Tuesday afternoons and Friday evenings in this way.

Auchenblae Bowling Club has reached out via its Facebook page to inform anyone interested in trying out bowls that future membership is open - even if this year we were not able to function as normal. Within the public health guidelines, chairman George Wilson arranged 'have a go 'session for a couple of inquirers. We hope that these expressions of interest will translate into new members joining in 2021 - with fingers crossed something near normal bowling can resume.

Auchenblae Lawn Bowling Club has become the official custodian of the stock of small 'Indoor Carpet Bowls' originally acquired many years ago by Auchenblae's Indoor Carpet Bowls Club that used to play in the village hall. These small size bowls are ideal for children to use to learn how to play outdoor bowls. There has been an informal arrangement in recent years allowing the Lawn Bowlers to 'borrow' these small bowls each summer for teaching sessions in collaboration with Auchenblae Primary School, enabling children to try out bowling. The children have greatly enjoyed this and so have their teachers - and the Bowling Club 'tutors'! Sadly this pandemic year, of course, the sessions couldn't happen. Because the Carpet Bowling Club has not played for some years, its members have now gifted these small bowls to Auchenblae Lawn Bowling Club for the benefit of youngsters' training in future seasons.

The Bowling Club AGM is due to held in February 2021 and further information on how this will go ahead will be publicised in due course.
