

We had our delayed summer outing to Fasque Estate in September 2022, with a tour and and talk on the history of the House and Estate. It was also great to see the passion and commitment given to renovating the House, all of the work being in keeping with its history. Thoroughly enjoyed by all.

We have had two talks this session, our first being a talk on Prehistoric Stone Cup and Ring marks (as found at St Paladius Chapel in Auchenblae) and the digital register of these marks in the Scottish Archive. Fascinating to see how a Covid inspired hobby became such a valuable national archive. In December we had a Genealogy talk on Mearns Migration to Canada, covering why so many families felt emigration was their only option, the background to crafting changes in our area and the journeys and lives of the families from the Mearns who created a Scottish Settlement in Canada.

West Mearns Parish Church

Dear Friends,

I have been asked by a few folk in the village about the future of the Auchenblae Church. I think the best response at this point, is to share the information we distributed in our latest issue of our magazine called Jottings, a Parish newsletter.


Most people are aware of the significant changes that are taking place in the Church of Scotland, all across Scotland. Many churches are closing and there is a shortage of ordained ministers. In terms of the Presbytery Plan, Glenbervie and Auchenblae Churches are to be closed. Fettercairn church will remain open. However, there is a requirement that we upgrade the Fettercairn church and the hall to make them more accessible and user friendly. Understandably this is a very difficult time for us, and the Kirk Session will be taking a number of decisions in the near future to enable us to continue our ministry as effectively as possible across our Parish.


In terms of ministers, the future scenario is that there will be one minister to cover the Parishes of West Mearns, Laurencekirk, Aberluthnott and St Cyrus. Clearly this is a very difficult scenario and the Kirk Sessions of the above Parishes have met to consider a way forward. What has been agreed to is that we start working towards a team ministry which includes both Lay and Clergy so that the mission of the church remains viable. This would include looking towards forming a Union or Linkage.

I have been asked the question about the timing of all of this. The Presbytery Plan covers the next five years beginning the 1st of January 2023. There will be an annual Presbytery review to monitor progress and as yet we have not received any guidelines as to how and when the buildings will be disposed of. So, in short, we don't know the specifics. Our understanding is that we have use of the buildings until such time and that could take a number of years.
