



SOME THOUGHTS ON CHRISTIAN AID WEEK 2003 (11th - 17th MAY)

On several occasions during these past months I have unfortunately had to spend time as a patient in Aberdeen Royal Infirmary, and not once, but many many times, I have reflected on how unbelievably fortunate we are to have a health service in this country which, when you're on the receiving end of its attention, is quite magnificent. I am lost for words to praise the skills, the commitment and the sheer friendship of the staff that I have encountered at every level.

But as well as reflecting on our own good fortune I have also been made painfully aware just how ill-divided this world is.. In fact, while in hospital, I filled in the little form on which we apply for all the materials we need to run Christian Aid Week in West Mearns, and as I filled in the details- a thousand little red envelopes-fifty posters, twentyfive sets of collectors' notes etc, etc...I couldn't help thinking that what was on the form wasn't just about bits of paper - it was about millions and millions of people for whom what I was receiving - medical attention, nutritious meals, clean sheets, a jug of fresh iced water three times a day - is *luxury beyond their wild-est imagination*.

But instead of throwing up our hands in horror and giving up because the problems of poverty, malnutrition and disease are totally beyond us, Christian Aid gives every one of us an opportunity **to light a candle rather than curse the darkness.** To carry out that bit of the work that *we* can do successfully in West Mearns, we need about twenty-one collectors. The lists will be in the three churches from Sunday 20th April when the appeal for helpers will be made. We've lost one of two of the stalwarts from previous years who have moved out of the area, so we really do need some new folk this year.

All of us have been made painfully aware of the horrendous task of reconstruction ahead in war-torn Iraq. But I wonder how many folk were aware that all the time the bombs were pounding Basra and Baghdad Christian Aid has been quietly supporting work among the stricken Kurds in Northern Iraq through a partner organisation called REACH (Rehabilitation, Education, and Community Health). This is almost always the way Christian Aid works - through local on-the-ground organisations who really know what the needs are, and how best they can be met.

And of course, while the spotlight has been on the suffering of the people in Iraq, Christian Aid has been at work in over 60 different countries where the need is greatest, helping people regardless of their religion, and believes always that local people are best placed to solve local problems. Our task in Christian Aid is to provide funding (aid *without any strings attached*) to enable projects to take place that meet the immediate and long term needs of some of the poorest people in the world.

To the folk of West Mearns I express the thanks of Christian Aid for your generous support in the past, and confidently appeal to your generosity yet again in Christian Aid Week this year.




