The logo of West Mearns Church is made up with representations of the three church buildings at Fettercairn, Glenbervie and Auchenblae.

The churches in these communities were united in 1995.

A NOTE ABOUT AUCHENBLAE CHURCH

VISITORS to the church at Auchenblae sometimes ask about the history of the church building, and which stands in the middle of the graveyard at what used to be called the *Kirkton of Fordoun*. The present church was erected in 1829 and replaced a building that was on the same site.

There has been a religious settlement on this same site since the sixth or seventh century. When the previous church building was dismantled, it was discovered thatthe pulpit was built over the pictish stone which has been mounted on the wall of the church vestibule. It depicts a hunting scene, but also clearly shows the Celtic interlacing pattern – a sure sign of the presence of a Church, which frequently used elements of existing culture in the proclamation of the Gospel rather than seeking to eliminate it.



Also in the graveyard, to the right of the Church (looking from the roadway) are the ruins of what is known as St. Paladius Chapel. Paladius was a contemporary (and possibly a disciple) of St. Columba of Iona. It is believed that this was possibly a funeral chapel, rather than a place of regular worship.

On a circular column to the left of the main church gate is a memorial to George Wishart, the first Protestant Martyr in Scotland, whose family came from Pitarrow a few miles west of Auchenblae.

Can we mention once again that dogs should not be walked along the path between the swings and the burn, as this area is solely designated for children.

The new faces of the fund will be Jean Guthrie, Wendy Reid and Tracey Harrison-Lewis.


